Through the proposed Recovery High School program, the Red Clay Consolidated School District will provide students in early recovery the academic, emotional and social support they need to make progress toward a high school diploma and to transition back into a traditional school setting.



ABOUT

Early intervention is key. Research over the last decade has shown that the risk of addiction is worse the younger a person starts using, but the prognosis for recovery improves the younger a person stops using (Hardin and Ernst, 2009; NIDA, 2010).

At the Recovery High School program, students in early recovery will have access to academic and therapeutic services to help them make progress toward a high school diploma and transition back into a traditional school setting.

Enrollment: 15-25 Students

Open to any Delaware High School Student

LOCATION

The Recovery High School program will be located at 1621 Telegraph Road in Wilmington, Delaware, in an existing Red Clay Consolidated School District facility. This will make use of available classrooms, offices and other areas for students and staff.
